### Tradition and Controversy: The Swastika at NMSU

This presentation will examine the history and controversy behind the New Mexico State University yearbooks. It's likely that few other college yearbooks have dealt with controversy and acquired such an interesting history simply because of the name. Selected in 1907 through a student contest, the yearbook became known as the Swastika. As the years went on, as one might imagine, questions began to be raised regarding the name. However, attempting to maintain a long tradition, NMSU held on to the yearbook name for nearly 40 years after the end of World War II, when it was eventually renamed The Phoenix. Come hear this unique and interesting story and learn about one of the lesser-known aspects of NMSU history. ■

## Final Report on repair of Stagecoach wheels

The repair and restoration of all four wheels of the DACHS "Stagecoach" on display at the Farm and Ranch Museum has been completed. The rear wheels were painted and mounted on the coach shortly after the last Historical Society meeting in May where one wheel was on display. The cost to repair the rear wheels was \$1,736.00 making the total cost to rebuild all four wheels \$3,270.00. Repair efforts involved complete disassembly of the wheels, replacement of most spokes with new hickory spokes and replacement of the felloes (the wood sections bolted to the steel rims) with new sections made of ash wood. The steel rims and the composition hubs were cleaned and tightened as needed. Discussions with Mrs. Toni Laumbach, NM Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum Chief Curator, concerning placement of the stagecoach in the display area in such a way to facilitate very brief removal of the coach for its possible display in community events was raised.

### Brief History of the Coach:

The coach is believed to have been used to carry passengers from El Paso (Franklin City), Texas to Parral, Mexico from 1852 to 1871. Hugh Milton believed that the coach was used on the Santa Fe to Chihuahua route.

The coach was bought by Dr. Paul Jones after it was found in an old Army Garrison south of Chihuahua, Mexico around 1972

The coach was restored prior to its appearance in the 1976 Las Cruces bicentennial parade with monies raised by the high school student bodies of both Las Cruces and Mayfield.

The coach was donated by Dr. and Mrs. Paul Jones to DACHS in December 1975

The coach was inspected by Mr. Kenneth Wheeling, editor of the Carriage Journal in 2010 who identified it as a modified "Hack Passenger Waggon, Model 209" in the Abbot-Downing catalog. ■
