Dan Aranda To Speak About Santiago McKinn

On Nov. 16, at 7 p.m., local historian and author Dan Aranda will talk about Santiago McKinn, an Apache captive. The talk is taken from Dan's just published book, *Episodes From Apache Lands* and is just one of its interesting chapters.

Mckinn was 10 years old when he was captured by Apaches on Friday, Sept. 11, 1885 near Faywood, NM. Dan has reprinted a photo of McKinn from when he was in captivity, a very rare item. McKinn was a captive for about six

months but was freed when a group of Apaches surrendered at Ft. Bowie in the spring of 1886.

Born in Las Cruces, in 1947, Dan is a re-

tired firefighter and member of several historical societies, including the Doña Ana County Historical Society, the Cochise County Historical Society, English Westerners and is a proud charter member of the Order of the Indian Wars, an organization dedicated to preserving this important part of our national heritage. In the late 1980's, Dan was the commander for the Department of the Rio Grande of Council on America's Military Past.
