David Thomas To Start Fall Speaker Series

Kicking off the fall season of DACHS presentations will be local historian and author David Thomas. The title of his talk is: *Giovanni Maria de Agostini, Hermit of La Cueva, New Discoveries.* The presentation will be September 19 at 7 p.m. in the auditorium at the Good Samaritan Facility - 3011 Buena Vida Circle.




In 2014 David published a book on the hermit who died at his cave in the La Cueva rocks just east of Las Cruces. We'd all heard the story of

how the hermit would light a bonfire to let people know in Las Cruces that he was all right. When the fire didn't appear one time, residents rode to his cave and found him dead. David provides the complicated back story on the hermit with his origins in Europe and his extensive travels in South America.

About David's work, New Mexico historian Rick Hendricks wrote: "David G. Thomas has finally pulled back the veil of obscurity that long shrouded one of the most enduring mysteries in New Mexico's long history to reveal the true story of the Hermit, Giovanni Maria de Agostini. Tracking Agostini from Italy throughout South and North America to his final resting place in Mesilla, Thomas has once again proven himself a master history detective. Of particular interest is the information about the Hermit's life in Brazil, which closely parallels his remarkable experience in New Mexico, and required extensive research in Portuguese sources. Thomas's efforts make it possible to understand this deeply religious man."

David G. Thomas has a BA and MS. He has authored 14 books on New Mexico history. He is a filmmaker, producer, playwright, and screenwriter. Also, he is a co-founder of the Pat Garrett Western Heritage Festival and co-founder of Friends of Pat Garrett. He is an associate producer of the 2019 documentary film "The Wonder of the Century," which is based on the his book about the hermit.

He is the winner of the 2020 Will Rogers Medallion Award, Western Biography, and the 2022 Will Rogers Medallion Award, Western Maverick.

Recently we've been out in the community recruiting new DACHS members. We set up tables at the Saturday downtown farmers' market and at the dedication event for the new Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site, with the result of signing on several new members. 3) Editor of the kind-of-monthly newsletter. This job requires a 4-page newsletter at the beginning of some months with two PDF versions - one for print by Insta-Copy and one for the webmaster to post. For this job you really need to be on the board so you know what is going on.

4) Coordinator for the annual Southern New Mexico Historical Review. This entails seeking articles, dealing with authors, collecting the articles and passing them to the editor, then putting everything together in the Review package you've seen the past few years. There is a PDF version to be printed by ABC Printing and a low-rez version for the website. Also you get to mail them out to the membership.

5) Audio-visual support at monthly meetings. Straight forward with getting the key to the auditorium sound room on the day of each event and then setting up the facility and the computer/projector.

6) I guess because I can do traditional print layout, I was also creating the programs for the annual awards banquets. You can see them online.

Fort Selden Historic Site offers weekly walking tours that are guided by a ranger. These are an opportunity to learn about the history of the site.


You can join a Fort Selden Historic Site ranger for a guided tour of the fort ruins in the morning. Participants will explore 1400 years of history from the Native American farmers, or Mogollon, who lived on this land as early as 400 A.D. to the Spanish in the late 1500s to the American military in the

mid-1800s. The tour is included as part of general admission of \$5 per adult. Children 16 years old and younger are free. NM residents over the age of 60 are free on Wednesdays.

Upcoming tours are on September 4, 11, 18, & 25, from 9 - 10 a.m. Fort Selden is at 1280 Fort Selden Road, Radium Springs, NM. Take I-25, Exit 19, Radium Springs – Follow the signs.
